INTRODUCTION

The Fine Art Program and Collection at Montefiore Medicine is proud to present Boundless Imagination: Creativity in the Time of Covid-19 from Studio in a School NYC.

Drawings, paintings, collages, sculptures, and digital art created by children and teens participating in Studio NYC programs during the 2020-21 academic year reflect the remarkable resourcefulness that art making can elicit from young, imaginative minds, even during the most challenging of times.

As public schools shifted to remote and hybrid learning in response to the pandemic, Studio NYC worked swiftly to develop new teaching models designed to connect with students and inspire them to produce art anywhere. Studio NYC Artist Instructors bridged the digital divide by beaming into homes and classrooms through live-streamed and recorded lessons.

Presented on a series of exhibition posters, the artworks powerfully demonstrate that creativity supports resiliency. Artist Instructors taught children to look at their surroundings with artists' eyes and come up with methods to make art in their homes, with minimal resources. Kitchens and living rooms were transformed into thriving studios while family members and caretakers became collaborators and documentarians. These exemplary artworks provide a glimpse into the outpouring of creativity as children across New York City explored their creative talents in inventive ways.

Studio NYC Artist Instructors are professional artists with established practice and in-depth understanding of the art making process. They guide children to discover the distinctive qualities of each medium through experimentation and play. Students learn to carefully observe the world and use the elements of art—line, shape, color, and texture—to capture their subjects. Studio NYC nurtures the artistry of children, recognizing that creative activity is instrumental to the wellbeing of young people. Artistic practice provides an outlet for self-expression, stimulates critical thinking, and increases confidence.

Boundless Imagination: Creativity in the Time of Covid-19 from Studio in a Studio in a School NYC spans across Montefiore's network of campuses, including The Gallery of ARTful Medicine at the Hutchinson Campus and the ARTViews Galleries at the Moses, Wakefield and Weiler Campuses.

ABOUT STUDIO IN A SCHOOL NYC

Studio in a School NYC (Studio NYC) is a non-profit organization that brings visual arts education to public schools and community-based organizations to students from pre-K to 12th-grade across New York City's five boroughs. Studio NYC is part of Studio in a School Association (Studio) founded in 1977 by Agnes Gund, philanthropist and President Emerita of the Museum of Modern Art.

In 1977, when drastic budget cuts virtually eliminated the arts from New York City public schools, Agnes Gund conceived a plan to restore visual arts instruction by engaging professional artists to teach in public schools. In Ms. Gund's words, "When we founded Studio in a School, we wanted to help the children, and we also wanted to help artists. It was during the fiscal crisis in the late 1970s, and artists needed help too. We started with three public schools and Studio in a School was born."

Since its foundation, Studio has grown to engage more than one million students through visual arts programs developed and conducted by arts professionals. In 2016, Studio expanded to other cities through Studio Institute. Today, Studio NYC alone annually provides visual arts instruction for 30,000 students most in need.

Regarding the exhibition, Alison Scott-Williams, President of Studio in a School NYC, remarks, "Studio in a School NYC is deeply honored to be the first to mount simultaneous exhibitions in all four of Montefiore's galleries. Montefiore is known for its incredible commitment to the health and wellbeing of New York City, so it is both remarkable and telling that they have dedicated so much physical space to bringing beauty to those in their care. This shines a powerful light on art's capacity to support the healing process. It is extraordinary to think that artwork, made by children and teens in the heart of a pandemic, can provide comfort, solace, and inspiration to Montefiore's patients and staff."

INTRODUCTION



In conjunction with *Boundless Imagination: Creativity in the Time of Covid-19* from Studio in a School NYC, the exhibition presents highlights from its permanent collection of student artworks, honoring the achievements of multiple generations of children growing up in New York City.

Studio NYC began collecting student art in the 1980s, with the goal to preserve and document exemplary works created through its programs. Today, the collection holds almost 2,000 pieces, many of which are featured in exhibitions around the world.

The drawings, paintings, collages, prints, and sculptures on view exemplify Studio NYC's enduring commitment to art education. We see the development of skills and capacities through the artistic choices the students made, whether they worked individually or collaboratively. This presentation celebrates not only the artworks on view, but even more so the effort, learning, growth, and creativity of every individual—from pre-kindergarten through high school—who participated in Studio NYC's programs over the past four decades.




