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Early Childhood: Exploring Stamping and Printing


In 2023-2024, Studio Artist Instructors teaching in Early Childhood programs introduced a new five-week curriculum. Three- and Four-year-old's explored stamping using tempera paint and a variety of tools: carboard, corks, spools, straws, wood cubes, forks, and sponges. Children discovered how to "press, lift, and press" a variety of tools into paint and on to paper to create unique and interesting patterns, shapes, and textures. During the culminating lesson, children created their own printing plate. They stamped a variety of shapes and textures onto cardboard to create their own print! This display illustrates five weeks of lessons created by children across Early Childhood Program sites.
